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### Board of Director's Meeting June 15, 2016

Adoption of the District's 2016 Drought Contingency Plan: The Board of Directors adopted Ordinance 2016-05 amending the District's Drought Contingency Plan to permanently prohibit certain water wasting practices as required by the State Water Resources Control Board. This decision was based upon the ongoing need to prevent the waste and unreasonable use of water and to promote conservation except where necessary to address an immediate health and safety need or to comply with a term or condition in a permit issued by the State or a Federal agency. The permanently prohibed acts include:

- The application of potable water to outdoor landscapes in a manner that causes runoff such that water flows onto adjacent property, non-irrigated areas, private and public walkways, roadways, parking lots or structures;
- The use of a hose that dispenses potable water to wash a motor vehicle, except where the hose is fitted with a shut-off nozzle or device attached to it that causes it to cease dispensing water immediately when not in use;
- The application of potable water to driveways and sidewalks;
- The use of potable water in a fountain or other decorative water feature, except where the water is part of a recirculating system;
- ◆ The application of potable water to outdoor landscapes during and within 48 hours after measurable rainfall;
- The irrigation with potable water of ornamental turf on public street medians;
- ♦ The irrigation with potable water of landscapes outside newly constructed homes and buildings in a manner inconsistent with regulations or other requirements established by the California Building Standards Commission and the Department of Housing and Community Development.

#### **Penalties for Violation:**

- 1. First Violation: Verbal warning and informational door hanger requiring immediate correction.
- 2. Second Violation: Written warning requiring immediate correction.
- 3. Third Violation: Assessment of a \$50.00 fine.
- 4. Fourth Violation: Assessment of a \$75.00 fine.
- 5. Fifth Violation: Assessment of a \$100.00 fine.
- 6. Sixth and Subsequent Violations: A fine not to exceed \$500.00 can be assessed for each violation.

# prought Update

The Board of Director's adopted Resolution 2016-07, implementing Stage 0—Voluntary Conservation—Full Water Allocation, of the District's newly adopted Drought Contingency Plan.

#### **Under Stage 0 the following apply:**

- 1. Potable water shall be used in a reasonable and beneficial manner.
- 2. Conservation of water is encouraged.
- 3. Outdoor use of potable water—All customers are encouraged to limit their outdoor use of potable water by:
  - I. Limiting outdoor irrigation to the hours between 12:00 am and 9:00 am and 6:00 pm to 12:00 am to maximize greater soil absorption while reducing the potential of evaporation; and
  - II. Limit the number of outdoor watering days to three per week.
- 4. The District will provide prompt notice to each customer whenever information is obtained indicating a leak exists within the end-users exclusive control. Faulty sprinklers, breaks, and/or leaks within the customer's plumbing system shall be repaired by the customer within the specified working days following District notice or once the leak is discovered by the customer as further described below \*:

- \* Note: Water service may be suspended until all repairs are made based upon Stage requirements being exceeded.
- 5. Newly constructed homes or buildings shall use drip, micro-spray, or other outdoor irrigation systems consistent with the regulations or other requirements as established by the California Building Standards Comision and the Department of Housing and Community Development.
- 6. The District shall provide all required reports as required by the State Water Resources Control Board.
