Be Mindful of Water Use

The following practices apply to all Stages of the District's Drought Contingency Plan.

1. **Prohibited Water Wasting Practices:** To prevent the waste and unreasonable use of water and to promote water conservation, each of the following actions is prohibited, except where necessary to address an immediate health and safety need or to comply with a term or condition in a permit issued by a State or Federal agency:
 - a. The application of potable water to outdoor landscapes in a manner that causes runoff such that water flows onto adjacent property, non-irrigated areas, private and public walkways, roadways, parking lots, or structures;
 - b. The use of a hose that dispenses potable water to wash a motor vehicle, except where the hose is fitted with a shut-off nozzle or device attached to it that causes it to cease dispensing water immediately when not in use;
 - c. The application of potable water to driveways and sidewalks;
 - d. The use of potable water in a fountain or other decorative water feature, except where the water is part of a recirculating system;
 - e. The application of potable water to outdoor landscapes during and within 48 hours after measurable rainfall.
 - f. The irrigation with potable water of ornamental turf on public street medians;
 - g. The irrigation with potable water of landscapes outside newly constructed homes and buildings in a manner inconsistent with regulations or other requirements established by the California Building Standards Commission and the Department of Housing and Community Development.
2. **Penalties for Violation:** The taking of any action prohibited in subsections 1.a thru 1.g above, is an infraction punishable by a fine as described below:

First Violation – Verbal warning and informational door hanger requiring immediate correction.

Second Violation – Written warning requiring immediate correction.

Third Violation – Assessment of a fifty dollar fine (\$50).

Fourth Violation – Assessment of a seventy-five dollar fine (\$75).

Fifth Violation – Assessment of a one-hundred dollar fine (\$100).

Sixth and Subsequent Violations – A fine not to exceed five-hundred dollars (\$500) can be assessed for each violation.

This month's billing showed high usage throughout the District. We are asking that you take the time to check your irrigation, faucets and toilets to verify that you have no leaks. Adopt a Hydrant . . . Help Stop Water Theft



We all know the value of high-quality, reliable water service. Unfortunately, there is a small number of individuals that attempt to obtain water service without paying for it. When this occurs, all customers pay the price.

To help us maintain a safe and reliable water system, we are asking that you please **Adopt a Hydrant** near you and inform us if the hydrant has been tampered with or if you see any maintenance issues that need to be addressed. A non-working fire hydrant can make a big difference in an emergency situation. Working together we can ensure that every hydrant is working at its optimum performance.

The only individuals authorized to use fire hydrants are Centerville CSD personnel, fire department personnel for fire emergencies, and approved hydrant meter users. It is important to note that the District only issues stationary hydrant meters which are installed by our staff. Please report any and all suspicious activity. Remember water theft ultimately costs you money. Help us protect this valuable resource.

If you need a construction meter, please contact the District Office.

Fines for violations are payable upon demand in the following amounts:

First violation: Cost of unauthorized water taken, plus a fine of up to \$250.00

Second violation: Cost of unauthorized water taken, plus a fine of up to \$500.00

Third and subsequent violations: Cost of unauthorized water taken, plus a fine of up to \$1,000 for each violation.

Fire Hydrant Tampering: In the event that a person violates the above cited restrictions, and as a part of such violation tampers with a fire hydrant thereby increasing danger to life and property, such fire hydrant tampering will result in immediate assessment of a fine of up to **\$1,000.00 per incident**, plus, may result in criminal charges being pressed pursuant to the provisions of the California Penal Code.
