Register for Code Red

SHASCOM 9-1-1, the county-wide 9-1-1 center uses CODE RED, an emergency citizen notification system for cell phones. Once you register your cell phone number, you will be able to receive emergency public safety warnings and alerts on behalf of law enforcement, the fire department and public health. These messages are critical community alerts which can include missing child reports, evacuation notices and other emergency notifications.

Did you cut your landline and now only have cell service? To register your cell phone, go to the SHASCOM 9-1-1 website, www.shascom911.com, and choose "Citizen Notification" near the top of the page. You can also access the links from the District's website. While registering you can choose to either receive a text or a voice message. TDD/TTY devices (telephones for the hearing impaired) may also be registered. You do not need to register your landline phone, as this data is already in the SHASCOM 9-1-1 system.

Approval of Financial Statements for Fiscal Year 2017-18

The Board of Directors adopted the District's Financial Statements for Fiscal Year ending June 30, 2018, as presented by Patty Brandon-Waterman of the accounting firm Hathaway, Ksenzulak and Lapp at their regular meeting held February 20, 2019.

The Independent Auditor's Report contains the opinions of the accounting firm regarding their review of the District's financial position as of June 30, 2018 and the results of its operations and changes in net assets and cash flow for the year. The review was conducted in conformity with the accounting principles and systems prescribed by the State Controller's Office and State regulations governing Special Districts.



History of Grant School . . .



To understand the history of Grant School, you must go back to the mid 1850's. As mentioned last month three small schools were consolidated into one school called the Centerville School which was located at Texas Springs and Placer Roads where the Grange Hall is now situated.

During the 1880's farmers started settling in this area. In 1885, Anton Schwegerl, grandfather and great-grandfather to the Nachreiner family, donated land for a new school. He named it Grant School because of its location to the west of a Mexican land grant owned by Pierson Reading (this land was located across Placer from what is now Olney Park Drive). It was a one room schoolhouse (18 feet by 22 feet) with one teacher. It had nine (9) grades and no kindergarten.

In 1946, Centerville School had declined in its enrollment but Grant School had increased its numbers so it was decided to move the Centerville School to the Grant School site - making Grant a two (2) room schoolhouse.
