

Office Conversion Project - CIP 14450

Did You Know.....

1. That the First Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade contained Central Park Zoo animals? The Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade was originally called the "Macy's Christmas Parade" to kick off the holiday shopping season, according to AM New York. Held in 1924, the first parade included a menagerie of circus mainstays, including monkeys, bears, camels, and elephants, all borrowed from the Central park Zoo, instead of the traditional character balloons.
2. That the Wishbone Tradition is much older than Thanksgiving? Turkey wishbones are commonly used in a good-luck tradition on Thanksgiving. Usually, the practice consists of two people tugging on either end of the brittle bone while silently making a wish until it breaks. It is said that whoever wins the larger piece will have their wish granted. This tradition dates back to the Etruscan civilization circa 322 B.C. The Romans brought the tradition with them when they conquered England, and the English colonists then proceeded to carry the tradition to America.
3. That the Pilgrims did not have fresh butter because they did not have any cows. Cows did not arrive in the New World until the Dutch brought them in 1624.
4. That President Thomas Jefferson refused to declare Thanksgiving as a holiday. Presidents originally had to declare Thanksgiving a holiday every year. History says Jefferson refused to recognize the event, because he strongly believed in the separation of church and state. Since Thanksgiving involved prayer and reflection, the president thought making it a national holiday would violate the First Amendment. He also thought it was better suited as a state holiday, not a federal one. But he never really explained himself to the public, so he went down in history as an anti-Thanksgiving leader.


