District Pays Off 1995-1 Loan

Centerville CSD Serving the Community Since 1959 November 2021

In 1995 the District made many improvements to the District's distribution and water treatment systems. Assessment District 1995-1 was formed and financed with limited obligation improvement bonds under the California Improvement Bond act of 1915. The original loan amount was a little over \$2,000,000 with semi-annual payments of approximately \$53,000 each. An assessment was placed on the tax rolls to cover the cost of the loan.

Throughout the years, additional funds have been received which permitted bond call payments to be made early. By making the early bond call payments the District was able to pay off the 1995-1 loan this month. Moving forward there will no longer be a 1995-1 Assessment on District customer's property taxes. This loan was paid off five years ahead of schedule!
