## The Value of Maintenance

### Reservoir Tanks

The average useful life of a Water Tank is approximately 75 years if properly maintained, and can be considerably longer if properly managed. Just like an old classic at Cool April Nights, these beauties can have a long life.



The District has a total of five water tanks all with varying degrees of needed maintenance including coating replacement, as well as, safety improvements required by OSHA.

At present, the District is reviewing options for its Tank Coating Maintenance Program. The purpose of this program is to manage and maintain the coating systems and ensure a safe and reliable water system.

### Hydrant Maintenance & Flushing



You may have noticed our Field Operators actively working on the Fire Hydrant Maintenance & Flushing Program. This is an important part of ensuring proper function of these vital facilities when they are needed for fire protection and other related emergencies. The conventional flushing also helps maintain the highest quality of water being provided to you.

### Valve Turning Program

The District's Water Distribution System is an essential investment in the community's infrastructure. Consisting of pipes, valves and hydrants, each plays an important role in ensuring water service and quality.



The ability to locate and operate valves in an emergency is imperative to the safety of the community. The District's Valve Maintenance Program is an essential proactive program to identify and prevent deficiencies in our water distribution system.

Although our afternoons may still be warm, winter will be here soon enough.


Once again, we ask you to join us in helping others stay warm this winter. We will be accepting new/used, child/adult coats,

### BOARD MEMBER VACANCY


